What Coalition?

The US and Britain cannot find "the willing" to lead

Washington says that in the war on Iraq they lead a coalition of 45 nations. This is a transparent sham:

- 15 of the 45 are *too ashamed* to be named.
- 24 of the rest are sending NO troops. This includes Spain!
- 4 are sending token numbers (*less than 300* at most).

That leaves Australia (2,000 troops), the UK (45,000) and the US (315,000). It's not a coalition, it's a gang.

Among the 15 not willing to be named are presumably Kuwait, Qatar, Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, Oman, the United Arab Emirates and Djibouti where US forces are based. *None of them will sign on in public*. Egypt might be another. And Israel is not on the list either.

Also conspicuous by their absence are NATO allies Canada, Belgium, and Norway (not just France and Germany) and the larger Central and South American countries Argentina, Brazil, Chile and Mexico. The full list, annotated:
